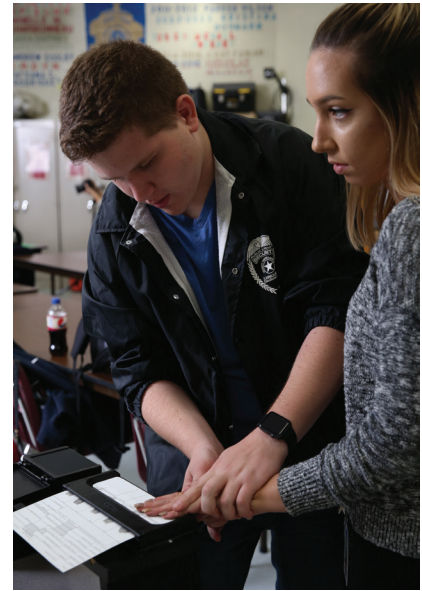




CRIMINAL JUSTICE STUDIES

A two-year program for students interested in careers in law enforcement, investigations, security, corrections, courts, law, social work and counseling, or other related fields.

- Students participate in mock trials, crime scene investigations, accident investigations, crime scene sketching, budget development, police reports, educational field trips, and community service projects.
- The curriculum is presented through classroom instruction, computer-based learning, and hands-on related activities and labs.
- Curriculum includes commencement level math and English language arts.
- All students are given the opportunity to participate in a Work-based Learning experience, which exposes them to the operation of a business and specific job duties related to careers in their CTE area. In Criminal Justice, 30 hours of internship include community service.
